Lisa Blunt Rochester

Congresswoman Lisa Blunt Rochester represents Delaware in the U.S. House of Representatives and serves as an Assistant Whip for House Leadership. Lisa sits on the House Committee on Energy and Commerce. The committee has broad jurisdiction over health care, the environment, commerce and trade, energy policy, telecommunications, manufacturing, and consumer protection.

As the Energy and Commerce Committee's only former statewide health official, Lisa understands health care from a number of different perspectives – as an implementer at the Delaware Department of Health and Social Services, negotiator while serving as State Personnel Director, and advocate as CEO of the Metropolitan Wilmington Urban League. Lisa is focused on reducing the cost of health care and prescription drugs for middle-class families, addressing the disparity in outcomes for communities of color, and tackling our nation's opioid and addiction epidemic. She serves as a Member of the Bipartisan Heroin Task Force, comprised of more than 100 members united with the common goal of tackling opioid addiction.

Lisa is a leading voice in Congress on economic and future of work-related issues. As former Secretary of Labor and State Personnel Director, Lisa leverages her professional experience to advocate for legislation that boosts start-up business growth, removes barriers for citizens reentering society, and addresses college affordability and ballooning student debt. She is a Co-Chair of the New Democrat Coalition's Future of Work Task Force and serves as the sole Member of Congress on the Aspen Institute's National Advisory Council for the Future of Work Initiative. She is also the founder of the Congressional Future of Work Caucus.

In the 115th Congress, Lisa was a member of the House Committee on Agriculture – the first Delawarean to serve on the committee in over 120 years. In this role, she helped craft the 2018 Farm Bill, which is a five-year re-authorization that extends U.S. Department of Agriculture programs related to the farm safety net; nutrition programs that feed children, seniors, people

with disabilities, and families who rely on the social support programs; land-grant and 1890 universities; and agriculture research.

As a member of the Congressional Progressive Caucus and a strong proponent of reforming our criminal justice system, Lisa introduced first-in-the-nation legislation, the Clean Slate Act, sealing the federal records of former nonviolent offenders that remain crime-free and have earned a second chance. This bill would provide new opportunities for Americans to earn a good-paying job, pursue education and training, and rent or own a home. According to estimates by the Center for American Progress, the passage of the Clean Slate Act could boost the U.S. economy by as much as \$87 billion per year.

Traveling up and down the state, Lisa is an advocate for the needs of every community, which informs her work in Washington. Having met with homeowners in the South Shore Marina development in North Bethany Beach, she learned of an error in the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's coastal mapping unit for the town – preventing homeowners from taking advantage of the National Flood Insurance Program and FEMA aid in the event of a disaster. Turning their concerns into action, Lisa reached across the aisle to work with Democrats and Republicans across the country with similarly affected mapping units and introduced the Strengthening Coastal Communities Act. She worked with allies in Delaware and Washington to help usher this critical piece of legislation into law – aiding homeowners and setting aside hundreds of acres for environmental protection.

With deep roots in the First State, Lisa grew up in Wilmington, graduated from Padua Academy, and worked her first job at the McDonald's on Market Street. She graduated from Fairleigh Dickinson University with a degree in International Relations and put herself through graduate school as a working mom – earning a master's degree in Urban Affairs and Public Policy from the University of Delaware.

Lisa began her distinguished career in public service as an intern and later Caseworker in a congressional office where she helped Delawareans with their Social Security benefits, disability insurance claims, IRS disputes, and housing needs. Lisa would go on to serve in the cabinets of two Delaware governors and as CEO of the Metropolitan Wilmington Urban League – an action-oriented, public policy research think-tank.

Lisa also served as the Senior Executive Leadership and Systems Manager for the Institute for Community Inclusion at the University of Massachusetts Boston where she advocated for people with disabilities in their struggle for equal opportunity and civil rights. During this time, Lisa helped expand the Institute's global footprint and advised state agencies and employers. In part due to Lisa's work, she helped build the Institute into a fully-fledged college at the university, the School for Global Inclusion and Social Development — focused on the inclusion of all people.

Lisa currently resides in Wilmington, Delaware near her adult-aged children, Alex and Alyssa, as well as her daughter-in-law, Ebony.



Joan Pendergrass

Joan has two focuses in her life: preserving Teddy Pendergrass' legacy and making a difference in the world. She currently spearheads efforts to raise money and awareness for individuals with spinal cord injuries through the Teddy and Joan Pendergrass Foundation. She also volunteers and donates to Rosie's Place in Boston, Pine Street Inn, Cradles to Crayons, Habitat for Humanity, and Boston Food Bank as well as mentoring young women in Belize and her native island of Dominica.

Prior to her relationship with Teddy, she worked in multiple professions securing a future and education for her children including managerial roles at New Balance, where she recently retired. Today, she is a frequent motivational speaker as she talks about her own journey through trauma. She was the recent subject of a television documentary, Victim No More: The Joan Pendergrass Story. Joan's memoir is expected to be published in 2021.



Dr. Wendy K. Smith

Wendy wants to advance both/and thinking toward a more sustainable, generative and thriving world.

Wendy received her B.A. in political science and psychology from Yale University and her Ph.D. in organizational behavior from Harvard Business School. She is currently Professor of Management at the Alfred Lerner School of Business at the University of Delaware and the Deutsch Family Fellow. She is also a Fellow at the Center for Social Innovation at Cambridge University's Judge Business School and at the Center for Sustainable Leadership at the Nova School of Business in Lisbon.

Wendy studies how we can adopt both/and approaches to more effectively navigate competing demands. We face ongoing tensions between work and life, advancing ourselves and helping others, advancing what we know or learning new skills. Leaders confront ongoing tensions between today and tomorrow, global integration and local distinctions, social missions and financial pressures. Wendy's research shows how a both/and approach leads to more generative and sustainable outcomes. Her research has been published in top academic journals such as *Academy of Management Journal*, *Academy of Management Review, Administrative Science Quarterly, Organization Science* and *Management Science*. From 2016-2019, she served as an associate editor at the *Academy of Management Journal*. In 2018, Wendy received University of Delaware's Mid-Career Excellence-In-Scholarship Award. In 2019, Web of Science recognized Wendy as a Highly Cited Researcher for being among the top 1% of scholars with the most cited research.

Wendy teaches leadership, organizational behavior and business ethics. She has taught MBAs and undergraduates at University of Delaware, Harvard, and University of Pennsylvania - Wharton. She won the MBA Teaching Award at the Lerner Business School in 2016 and 2019, and was runner-up for this award in 2018. Wendy founded and leads the Lerner Women's Leadership Forum, a 3-day executive forum for mid-career women. Wendy also engages with executive and senior leadership teams around the world, providing teaching, consulting and keynote talks to address the challenges of leadership, managing strategic paradoxes, and advancing in organizational change and innovation.

In 2016, Wendy co-founded the Women's Leadership Initiative at University of Delaware, an initiative to advance gender equity through education, advocacy and research. In 2019, she received the Delaware Today's Women in Business Award.

Wendy lives in Philadelphia with her husband and three children.



Kay White

About fifteen years ago, during the Great Recession, Leticia Gomez started Savvy Literary Services. She had multiple strikes against her.

Despite these undesirable circumstances, she has distinguished herself as a prominent literary/film/television agent who has helped her clients secure deals with the largest publishers in the world and seen several of her projects successfully optioned for film and television rights. To date, she has placed close to 200 non-fiction and fiction books with independent and mainstream traditional publishers. According to Publisher's Marketplace she is currently the #4 ranked agent in Non-fiction/Advice Relationship, #5 in Non-fiction Narrative, and #9 in Non-fiction books.
